

RESOLUTION OF ALSA INDONESIA VIRTUAL ACADEMIC DISCUSSION #2

“The Treaty for Extradition Between Indonesia and Singapore to Ensure World Order”

ALSA Indonesia with 5 (five) Local Chapters who participated in ALSA Indonesia Virtual Academic Discussion #2 have expressed support for the Treaty for Extradition Between Indonesia and Singapore with some points, as follows:

1. Since the extradition treaty are important tools in combating transnational crimes, it is essential to ensure that such agreements comply with international law and human rights standards to uphold justice and the rule of law;
2. It is important to note that the implementation of extradition treaty should comply with International Criminal Law, particularly in regards to human rights protections and due process;
3. The treaty must tackle the effectiveness concerns because there is possibility that extradition agreements may not be effective in combating transnational crimes, as it may be difficult to obtain evidence or cooperation from the other country's authority; and
4. Considering that each state are entitled to handle their own criminal justice system, the treaty might infringe upon a nation's sovereignty. Therefore, the parties must ensure that the extradition could not be used as a political tool and may not be abused by governments to pursue political dissidents or opponents.
